Reconciliation

As you read this book, you will discover that reconciliation is possible. I believe God is going to open your eyes and show you the way to this reality. The definition of reconcile is to reestablish a close relationship, to settle or resolve, to bring oneself to accept, to make compatible or consistent, to reestablish a close relationship as in marriage, to be compatible or consistent.

This teaching is for those of you who are going through a separation, a divorce, or loss of a friendship. I will primarily focus on reconciling a marriage, but the same principles can be used in any relationship. There is no guarantee that you will be reunited with your loved one, but there is one thing you can hang onto by faith. If you will receive, during this difficult trial, an invitation to grow in humility and in love, you will emerge the victor!

There are a lot of people who go through problems in relationships. Many times the difficulties start with disagreements in communication, money, or the showing of affection. These leads to a breakdown in the relationship, it starts to fall apart. The next thing is that the people say they are not in love anymore. One of the persons wants to be reconciled and the other doesn't. What do you do now? There's a lot of heartache---the person who wants to be reconciled gets hurt and the one who doesn't want to be around gets hurt. The objective is to bring you into relationship so the issue(s) can be solved.

I want to give you some tremendous insights so your relationship can be reconciled. First we must learn what some of the causes are of separation. Some of these causes are from bad behaviors. People can do dumb things! Their attitudes, the way they say things, the way they do things, their demeanor, the way they do certain things breaks down the relationship. There can be laziness---one person does all the dishes and the other never helps. This could be due to learned behavior or just bad manners. So what we want to do is to identify them so we can change them. Here's a partial list of the situations people get into: blaming others, having a critical spirit, impatience, lack of kindness, lack of manners, unnecessary roughness, disregarding boundaries, and physical abuse.

When people have these bad behaviors, it usually involves not taking responsibility that belongs to them. When you can look at the situation and say "yes, I was irresponsible in an area that I need to be responsible in now." In order to make that change, how is the other person going to trust you? This is a problem. There were many things going on in the relationship along the way that caused the breakdown. Most of the time there is a lack of trust. Trust can be regained by understanding boundaries. When someone says, "I don't really want you to do that". You need to hear what they are saying and do something about it.

SOW BOUNTIFULLY

The Bible tells us if you sow bountifully, you will reap bountifully. 2 Cor 9:6 tells us, "But this I say, he which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly. He which soweth bountifully, shall reap also Bountifully." So most people do not ever sow into their relationship.

Sow what? Sow kindness, sow gentleness, sow patience, sow good manners, sow whatever your loved one would like. You cannot reap out of your marriage unless you have sown into it.

Basically, people naturally respond to positively enhanced relationships. So you need to thank your husband or wife for getting your attention through such a courageous act as separation. It's a wake up call. Most people do not see it as that. You need to thank her or him for not tolerating your unloving behavior any longer and for sending you on a course of learning. When you recognize the wake up call that your loved one is gone, you wonder what caused that separation. You stop and think that maybe you were the problem. How do I make the necessary changes?

So if you are going to sow, sow into your relationship before you can reap bountifully. Sowing is an act of kindness. But you say that the relationship is already over with. Now what do you do? Start changing now! Practice with your friends being a nice person again. Say kind, loving remarks that you never used to say. Quit your cussing. Quit your smoking. Quit the old negative attitude and the things you used to do. Then when you see your loved one again, you won't act the same old way and have to walk on eggshells. That's walking in fear and God has not given us a spirit of fear. So start changing your unloving behavior.

A PERSON'S SPIRIT CLOSES DOWN

Frequently, before and during a separation, *a person's spirit closes down*. It can be called spiraling or shutting down. That person won't talk anymore, he or she just closes down when that happens, it's difficult to break through and get them to talk. Many people fail to realize that, little by little; their actions can slowly close the other person's spirit. How are you going to know this is occurring? Here are some of the ways to tell your loved one's spirit is closed. You can sense he or she is avoiding you, there is a lack of respect, there are no romantic feelings, and there is no response to touch. These behaviors signal there is something wrong here-that person may still be with you, but is no longer communicating. What's been said and done in the past has built up until he or she wants to forget the whole thing.

Proverbs 15:4 says, "a wholesome tongue is a tree of life." In other words, when someone speaks good things to you, it brings life. Continuing on it says, "but perverseness therein is a breach in the spirit." So with unwholesome words spoken, a person's spirit begins to close down. The one who spoke these words can become frustrated and angry when the other person fails to respond and say those stupid words again and start the cycle all over again.

You should realize there is a boundary here that you cannot go past. Give your partner the time and the space to calm down so that there can be talk between you later. You don't have to push the buttons right now.

OPEN A CLOSED SPIRIT

How do we open a closed spirit? The best way is to be tender, gentle, meek, and very sensitive. It would be better to say, "I didn't realize I did that to you", instead of yelling, instead of ranting and

railing. Then say, “I must have done something to hurt you. Would you like to talk about it now?” See how the gentleness and meekness comes out in your words, not pushing----just letting it flow?

The Bible tells us in Proverbs 15:1 that “a soft answer turns away wrath, but grievous words stir up anger.” So if you want to *open a closed spirit*, you can’t say, “What do you think you’re doing? How come you’re acting like that? What’s the deal here? When are you going to get with the program?” That’s not going to open up the spirit.

Some people think that if they are forceful and authoritative causing fear that the other person will talk to them. No way.

I know because I used to do this when I worked in the car business. I used to say to those who worked under me, “What do you think you’re doing?” After a while, the person wouldn’t talk to me. I’d ask myself what was wrong with him. If you don’t snap out of this, I’m going to fire you! After a while I figured it out. I must talk to them like a person, like I want to be talked to. That’s the Golden Rule. I then found out they were pretty neat people.

So in a relationship, you want to talk tenderly. “Did that hurt you? I’m sorry.” As you begin to speak softly, the other person will let down their wall and open up their spirit. They will be able to say, “OK, this is what happened. I can talk now. I feel better.” When you get the person to talk, then you have communication going and you can build a bridge.

BEING UNDERSTANDING

Have you ever built a bridge in your relationships? Make sure you build a big enough one that has six lanes so, if you have an accident on your bridge, you can get some communication back and forth. Most people build little footbridges. When they have an accident, the bridge is blocked and no one talks. So build a bridge you can get across on, even if you have a little problem out there.

Let’s discuss *being understanding*. Be focused on the person. Make eye contact. If you are going to open up this person’s spirit, you have to be sincere. You know when you are being kind. You don’t have an ulterior motive---wanting to be liked or because you want something. If you are working on a relationship and want reconciliation, you had better be a sincere person, speaking out of your heart, instead of just trying to manipulate the other person.

So talk sincerely. Look the other person straight in the eyes. Mean what you’re saying. You have to know that what you talk about makes sense to them. Don’t manipulate with your sincerity, just talk to the other person and say, “This is how I felt.” Feelings aren’t wrong. You may feel angry or happy; there’s nothing wrong with that. After you have spoken, take time to understand what he or she is saying. Let them have an opportunity to speak out with their feelings. So be focused on the person, making eye contact. When you begin to make contact with that person, you’re showing sincerity, you’re showing gentleness, you’re showing a whole lot of different things----you’re being tender, meek, etc.

Proverbs 14:12 says, “there is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death.” “I thought I was doing OK, but she just walked out on me. I thought everything was cool. I thought we were getting along.” You think you are doing right, but the other person doesn’t receive it that way. Are you in this place? The answer when you are seeking reconciliation

is to ask questions of the other person to see if you are both perceiving things the same. “Am I talking gently to you? Is this working? Is it OK?” The other person will respond positively to you. “Yes, I like that.” Now you are on an even keel, where you are now starting to build a communication bridge.

Find out where the other person is, don't get angry. try to understand. When you go down to order hamburgers, french fries and a chocolate milkshake, and come back with a cheeseburger, onion rings and a coke there has been miscommunication. You ordered it, paid the price, but got something entirely different. So the ways of a man seem right, he thinks he did it right, but it didn't end up right. So in the communication of reconciliation, you want to find out how you're doing. The person whose spirit you're trying to open up will tell you.

If I say something to my wife, are the words a boulder to smash her or pebbles that cause no harm? She could come back and say, “What you just said felt heavy to me, like a boulder.” Then I would know that I'm in trouble, there's a big problem. To me, it might seem like a piece of sand and wonder why this is a problem for her. As far as I was concerned, everything should be all right.

In general, men and women think differently. We must remember that women think based on feelings, based on how they feel and whether they were hurt, what has been going on, and whether all the actions line up with what was said. To test this, you can ask her and she will usually say something like, “This is how it made me feel when you said those words and did those things.”

So, you have to make the adjustment. That's why you're reading this----to learn how to make the adjustment so you can be reconciled. Those that are flexible, never break. You may think that it's hard to change, but it's not if you want reconciliation. You must change first. You may think that the other person needs to change first----that's called blaming. Remember?

ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THE OTHER PERSON IS HURTING

We need to also *acknowledge that the other person is hurting*. Words hurt. The old saying that sticks and stones may break my bones, but names can never hurt is a lie. When someone calls you a derogatory name, it hurts. If the person's actions haven't changed, his behavior is bad, and he's critical on top of it, there's a surefire recipe for disaster in the relationship. “How come you can't fix dinner right? Can't you ever do anything right?” These are examples of being critical. It's not just what words are said, but the tone of voice used also. Men run when women start “nagging.” It's not just what you say, but how you say it. A high pitched voice is like playing a violin in the wrong key. A man will not hear the words that are spoken; he will only hear the noise. Soft, gentle, easy words that are spoken will cause the other person to want to listen. “Oh, I see what you're saying. You're saying this....” And you start to come back with, “Yes, that's what I'm saying. That's what makes me feel this way.” When you do this, you start to communicate because there is understanding.

If you find out your partner has been hurting, you need to admit your mistakes and seek forgiveness. “I did that and it hurt you? I'm really sorry. Will you forgive me?” What can they say? If the other person can't forgive you right now because they're too upset, then back off. Don't go over the boundary. You've done what you could do to open the spirit, so ask if you can come back and talk to them later when things calm down. If that's what the other person wants, then go away.

Allow them to simmer down, let them think about what you've said so the hurt can dissipate. Then the forgiveness will be easy, because right now, "All you want to do is get off the hook, you don't want to hear what I've got to say." That's what people think, instead of saying, "I really am sorry, because I'm doing it with a sincere heart." If you're going to try to reconcile with someone, you need to say it.

What's the Bible say in Matt.18: 21, 22, and 35? "Then came Peter to Jesus and said, 'Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me and I forgive him? 'Till seven times?' Jesus saith unto him, 'I say not unto thee, until seven times; but, until seventy times seven.'" In other words, if a person comes to you and admits his mistakes and seeks your forgiveness; as often as they do it, forgive them. Release it. Break the hold that's holding them down and binding them up. Let them go. Take the bands and burdens off of them and let them be and forgive them. Because the Bible says in verses 34 and 35, that if you do not forgive with your heart, neither will my Father in heaven forgive you your trespasses.

He forgives us by the blood of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. If we don't forgive also, how are we to get reconciliation? You need to be reconciled, so forgive. It doesn't matter whose fault it was. Forgive and let it go, because if you don't, the hurt keeps festering. If it keeps festering, you keep mulling over the hurt. Someone can put salt on the wound, and you can become angrier. So seek forgiveness, admit the mistakes, and watch the healing come forth. It works because you forgave with your heart.

Some people in the past have said to me, "I can forgive you, but I will never forget." Have you ever heard those words? Did they really forgive? Not really. You know what? If you really forgive, you will forget the pain, but not the facts. Let the pain go, let it disperse. You can see that by doing these things, you can be reconciled.

SHOWING GENUINE SINCERE REPENTANCE

In the fourth chapter of James, it talks about *showing genuine sincere repentance*. If you are going to seek forgiveness, turn away from the things you used to do. If you were bad, be good. If you were good, get better. The person you are trying to reconcile with is hurt, angry, upset, bitter, and has a closed spirit. If you want to get this situation reconciled, be genuine. People can tell when they're being conned. So have a genuine, repentant heart. Crocodile tears don't work. Crocodiles cry so they can get close and eat you up. That's not the object here. Being genuinely repentant is being humble. Get rid of your pride. Pride is being on an ego trip. When you get rid of the pride, the ego trip, the selfishness, things turn around. It's a matter of the heart, the mind, and the behavior.

James 4:6, 7, 8a says, "But He giveth more grace. Wherefore He saith, 'God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw nigh to God and He will draw nigh to you.'" So God resists the proud and gives grace to the humble. If you humble yourself, are genuinely repentant to this person, and show humility, God will work with you to get rid of the pride and give you His grace. The other person will give you mercy. It may not happen at that moment, but it will happen because you are genuinely seeking reconciliation. This works because it's based on the Word of God.

START HONORING THE OTHER PERSON

Start honoring the other person. It's the cornerstone for restoring and building relationships. So you need to put honor into action. It's a new behavior. Honor means to bend the knee. In the days of the Knights in Shining Armor, they showed honor to the King by bending their knees and bowing down before him, giving homage to him. Today, when we are in a courtroom and the Judge enters, everyone must rise. We stand to show appreciation and honor for which he is. We stand to pledge allegiance to the flag, and as we put our hands on our hearts, we are showing honor to our country and to the Lord who blesses us.

How do you honor your relationship? Honor is the building block or cornerstone to restore your relationship. So if you are going to honor someone, be excited and show excitement at being with that person. Remember when we talked earlier about the squeaky violin? Do you know how much a Stradivarius is worth? \$100,000? If I put it in your hand, how would you hold it? You would hold it very carefully, because you know the value of it. If it broke, you wouldn't have \$100,000 to replace it.

Here's another example. When you go to a jewelry store to look at diamond rings, the salesperson brings out the diamond on velvet, picking it up carefully and gently, showing you how precious the stone is. What is he doing? He's showing honor to the diamond, showing how valued it is. So what's the person worth with whom you want to be reconciled? How many honors are you giving this person? You may think that you're trying to honor that person. Remember that the ways of a man when he thinks he's doing it right may be headed in the wrong direction. Find out from the person what it takes to show them honor. What does that person like? "Well, it would show me a lot more honor if you did...., if you said...., if you would only do these things...." Notice there is an action that has to be done. If you start doing these things they tell you to do, you're respecting them and giving them honor. That's a building block---it doesn't mean you're going to get reconciled because you did something. It's just showing them that you're a person and you appreciate them, you value their worth. The more value you put on them, the more they're worth. You honor things, so honor the person.

HONOR ALL MEN

The Bible tells us in I Pet.2: 17, "*Honor all men.* Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the King." Men in this passage refer to mankind, men and women. Honor them. Bend your knee. Show a little respect. If you want your relationship to grow, you need to keep honoring the other person. Remember I said this is a building block, and you have to have your foundation strong. So what does the Bible say? Honor all men. It also says to honor your mother and your father so you may live long on the earth. Just because I honored them and they treated me like this? Yes! We have all seen young people who didn't honor their parents and who have died early, in automobile accidents and many other ways. It's a fact that if you honor them, you'll live a long time.

So what's going to happen if you start honoring your relationship to the person with whom you want to reconcile? Show them honor by maintaining your boundaries, being gentle with them, speaking kindly to them, improving on your good manners. You know, when you eat, you should

eat with your mouth closed, not throw your silverware around, and should try to carry on some conversation between bites. Change your attitude! If you don't know how to have good manners, there are plenty of books to teach you so that you can be a respected person. Be a winner and be someone who's fun to be with. People want to be around positive people, instead of someone who is negative all the time. When you are really sincere and show honor to the other person, it changes the whole atmosphere.

DEVELOP SACRIFICIAL LOVE.

Also in helping to change your relationship so you can reconcile, you want to *develop sacrificial love*. A developmental stage is when toddlers fall down frequently when they are learning to walk. Developing means you keep working at something until you get it perfect. Once you get it perfect, you keep enhancing it and make it better. When you're developing sacrificial love, you're putting the other person ahead of your wants and desires becoming a servant in action and attitude.

Developing sacrificial love means when you want to do something that the other person doesn't want to do, you do what they want to do. It could be going to the movie or restaurant of their choice, having the dinner they want at home or ordering their favorite paper. Honor them; sacrifice your wants and desires to appease them. Right? Wrong! You do it because you want to----that's the difference. It's a change in attitude. You find out that you're not losing or giving up something, but that you can esteem and honor this person. You show them that you are honoring them by doing what they want to do. You are building blocks for reconciliation.

So become a servant in action and attitude. The Bible says for a woman to arrange herself under her husband. That's an attitude called submissiveness. It doesn't mean being a doormat. Being a servant is an attitude. "Oh sure, I'll be glad to do that for you. Let me open the door for you. Let me do these things for you. Let me show you how much I respect and honor you by doing certain things. Why don't you sit down tonight and let me get the kids ready for bed. Why don't you go ahead and take a bubble bath, put a little perfume in there and light a candle and I'll do the dishes and vacuum the floor. You go ahead and have fun. Let me take some of the workload off of you. Why don't you go and visit one of your girlfriends this afternoon and go shopping. Here's some money."

What are you doing? You're showing sacrificial love because that's what they desire, not exactly what you want to do. You're doing this because it makes them happy. What are you doing? Reconciling You're working something out. You did a bunch of dumb behavior things and now it's time to change. When the other person sees the genuine repentance and change in your attitude, they're going to open up and trust you. That's what all of this is about.

FINANCIALLY SUPPORT YOUR FAMILY

You also need to continually *financially support your family*. If you are a separated husband, you still need to support the other person. You do this not because they want you to, but because you want to show them sacrificial love. You want to love them. Love is not something you say it's something you do. Providing financially is a loving thing to do. Let's take a look at I Tim 5:8, "But

if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own home, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel.” So if you have a desire to reconcile, don’t let money get in the way. Just because your spouse has left, take care of the bills that must be paid. Do it because it shows you care for this person, that you’re building a relationship bridge that’s coming together.

INITIATE CHANGE IN YOURSELF

You also need to *initiate change in yourself*. If you’re going build this bridge, no matter what the situation, you be the initiator of change. Don’t wait for the other person to change, you change first. Find out if your knowledge of God is growing. Col. 1:10 says, “That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God.” How many would say that, if you were going to make a change that would be a good thing to change? You want to show good works in every area of your life. If you increase in the knowledge of God, what do you think your relationship is going to do? It’s going to increase because you’re learning the correct procedure of loving. That’s what it’s all about. So reconciliation can happen very quickly because God is in the midst of it. Amen!

GOD’S WILL ON MARRIAGE?

What’s *God’s will on marriage*? God is for your marriage to reunite. So if you’re separated, or even divorced, God still wants you in a position to be reconciled. We know many people have hard hearts. Like I said previously, there is no guarantee, but these things we are talking about get you in the right area. In the very least, you will get your heart set and learn how to grow in humility and love. That’s important so you can be a good person for the community. Let’s take a look at Matt.19: 6 which says, “Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder.” How many men and women put their marriages asunder? They are looking for a way out, instead of a way in. Every time I’ve run across someone who’s going through a trial separation or divorce, they’re looking for a way out instead of a way in. It’s the only time they keep their word. “I’ve got to divorce you.” Even if a person will lie the rest of the time, he will keep his word when he wants to cut the cord.

If you want your marriage reconciled, remember not to put it asunder. Don’t say anything to destroy it. Let’s take a look at Gen.2:18-25. “And the Lord God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him. And the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept; and He took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof; and the rib, which the Lord God had taken from man, made He a woman, and brought her unto the man. And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man. Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife; and they shall be one flesh. And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed.” So you can see God’s will---He created them and He wanted them to be together.

Let’s take a look at Mal.2:14-16. “...Because the Lord hath been witness between thee and the wife of thy youth, against whom thou hast dealt treacherously; yet is she thy companion, and the wife of thy covenant. And did not He make one? Yet had He the residue of the Spirit. And wherefore

one? That He might seek a godly seed. Therefore take heed to your spirit, and let none deal treacherously against the wife of his youth. For the Lord, the God of Israel, saith that He hateth putting away; for one covereth violence with his garment, saith the Lord of hosts; therefore take heed to your spirit, that ye deal not treacherously.” The Lord is saying that He was a witness between you and your wife in your marriage vows. Isn’t that good news?

God hates divorce. What happens in divorce? Kids get separated from their mother or father; people get mad, all kinds of negative things happen. All the tearing of hearts hurts. God sees the pain of His people and He doesn’t want them to go through that.

His will for you is not to get divorced. His will for you is reconciliation. Because of the hardness of their hearts, people don’t always reconcile. This teaching is to give you understanding, so you don’t have to have hardness of heart. What kind of relationships are you going to have if you keep a hard heart? People will wonder what’s wrong with you. You’ll have bitterness and hurt in your heart, not having them taken out.

GOD’S PROMISE TO YOU

That’s the idea of getting reconciled. The first thing is to get reconciled to the Lord. Let’s take a look at *God’s promise to you*. Since He hates divorce, if we pray for your marriage to be healed, we’re praying according to His will. God has a very high regard for marriage and He doesn’t like anybody getting in the middle of it. So if you know anyone whose going through marriage problems, don’t ever take sides with any person.

The wife may say, “He beat me up. Look at my black eye. I think I’m going to leave him.” Don’t ever take sides and tell her to do that. You only heard one side. Maybe she did something really bad to provoke him, and she’s not telling you that part. If you get into agreement, it makes it really harder to get the reconciliation. She may say that you have agreed with her and use you as a leverage for her. Stay out of the problem. When you’re asked what to do, tell her to pray and get God’s direction. What is God’s will?

Shouldn’t she forgive him? Even after what he did and how he treated her? The best thing to do is to sit down and help her get some of that poison out of her and let some of that hurt be released. Each of us needs to be free of hurting in order to love again.

So when someone comes to you, lead him or her to the Word of God. God wants reconciliation; He doesn’t want you angry with another person. We don’t fight flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers in heavenly places. It’s the devil’s fault! Get them to look at the problem from a Godly perspective. Don’t take sides and don’t tell them what to do. Give them insights; let the Holy Spirit give them revelation and illumination of what to do. He’s the One who created us, so we ought to let the power of the Lord give us correct answers. He is the Answer. Amen!

I John5:14,15 says, “And this is the confidence that we have in Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He heareth us; and if we know that He hears us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of Him.” God’s will in marriage is that He desires reconciliation. If you know it is His will, you can pray for the marriage to be healed. He will hear your prayer.

HIS WORD IS TRUTH

God is really good at taking care of people's hearts. God is not a liar. We know that God doesn't lie. He's "not a man, that He should lie; neither the son of man, that He should repent..." Num.23:19. *His Word is Truth*. Let's take a look at Matt.19:26. We start to understand that the Lord is for us, He's for our marriage. We need to recognize people can get hardened. "And Jesus beheld them, and said unto them, 'With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.'" So when you pray the prayer for reconciliation, recognize ALL things are possible.

If you have done the things we have written, and pray to the Lord, you are going to get help. There is no time limit. It may not happen immediately. It could, but don't put God in a box! If you alone say a prayer according to God's will, even if your spouse is not in agreement and it involves changing their will, God's Word is not void just because one person has given up. If you walk in faith, God will change the circumstances to make His Word come to pass. If you are going to pray, stay in faith.

THE BIBLE WILL COME TO PASS

If you are going to believe God, you are going to operate in His principles. One of these principles is to walk in love. Let's take a look at Ps.138:2. "I will worship toward Thy holy temple, and praise Thy name for Thy lovingkindness and for Thy truth; for Thou hast magnified Thy word above all Thy name." *The Bible will come to pass* on your behalf because you believe God for reconciliation. You can reconcile, you can have friendships. It doesn't always mean you will be remarried. The fact is, there is no sense having discomfort and hurts between you, being angry and mad and spiteful and allowing the child inside of you to be beat up. What I want you to know, beyond the shadow of a doubt, is that it is God's will is for reconciliation.

SHORT-CIRCUIT GOD'S POWER

The only way to *short-circuit God's power* is with your mouth. If you pray a prayer, believe with your heart, then open your mouth, and say the wrong things, you're going to short-circuit God. An example would be to say, "I am praying for reconciliation, but I don't think God is going to do it." You've just short-circuited God. Let's look at IICor.5:7. "For we walk by faith, not by sight." Open your mouth and speak words of faith. Don't open your mouth and speak words of doubt and unbelief and fear. "Well, I prayed the prayer and then I went over to see her and she said this and did that. Now I don't think it's going to happen." Now you are walking by sight and not by faith. "I prayed the prayer, she acted out and did these dumb things. I still showed love, staying gentle and showing her that I care and honor her. She is going to notice that I have changed."

Then the next time you see her, no matter how badly she treats you, when you respond again in a caring, gentle manner she will melt and not behave in a hostile way anymore. The next thing you know, you will be on a date headed for reconciliation. If you only hear what is being said, get mad

and start yelling back, you have just walked out of love. You just canceled all your prayers because you did not put love into action. That's what happens many times to people's reconciliation. It starts to happen. One person's heart starts to turn, even though the words have not changed. If you walk by sight and not by faith at this point, you can blow the whole thing.

This can happen on either side, male or female. It could be a friendship or a broken relationship between a parent and grown child. You need to know how to bring these relationships back together again. People act out all the time. Acting out causes problems---bad behavior. When you recognize someone is acting out, let him or her go through their feelings, then talk to them when they are done. They'll open up their spirit.

Be kind, be gentle and in a couple of days you will have them eating out of the palm of your hand---
-it's called reconciliation.

KEY TO RECONCILIATION

How many want a *key to reconciliation*? A key unlocks something and this key will give you a wonderful insight for restoration. In Matt.6:33 it says, "But seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you." But seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these restorations in marriage and reconciliation will be added unto you. Do you all see the key there? If you seek first God by taking up His Word and living it, not just saying it, you will be putting the rubber to the road.

If you are going to be gentle, be gentle. If you are going to be meek, be meek. If you are going to be humble, be humble. If you are going to be good mannered, be good mannered. If you are going to have all these things, walk the walk. That's the key to success in anything, but right now for reconciliation, the key to success is to follow after God, Who is love. God is love. When you get Him working inside of you, it's an awesome thing.

God is the heart-changer and will change your unsaved or rebelling partner because of your intercession. He will change you also because of your willingness and will come up with a winning one-flesh team. Regardless of what you see, because you walk by faith not by sight, you are going to believe God. I knew a man whose wife kicked him out of the house and divorced him. Ten years later, he remarried her. The Lord told him that his marriage was going to be reconciled and that he should go back to her. So he bought her a ring, went up to the house, and knocked on the door. When she opened the door and saw the ring, she grabbed it and threw it out on the grass! \$500 thrown out on the grass. He did not get upset. He just said, "OK, thank you very much." He went over to the lawn area and said, "OK, God, where is my ring?" He found it, picked it up and put it in his pocket. A few days later he went back and did it again and this time she put it on.

I know another man who has married his wife three times. I asked the woman why they had gotten divorced and remarried three times. She said they had acted out, had money problems, didn't listen to one another, anger got in the way so we got divorced. We got married again and the same things happened, again we got divorced. We got married again and we said we finally got this figured out. No more anger, no more not listening to one another, they stopped acting out and now they are happy. They realized they were being selfish, and when the other would not do what they wanted, they would get angry. They found out if they showed unconditional love, sowed into the other's

heart, giving what pleased that person, they would reap a positive response. They still, to this day, have a happy marriage. Don't be discouraged. God can do all kinds of things!

ASK THE LORD TO SAVE US

So let's *ask the Lord to save us*, to make us new, to reconcile us to Him. While we were yet sinners, rebellious and turning away from God, He loved us and gave us His Son. Let's take a look at 2Cor.5:17-19. "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature, old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. And all things are of God, Who hath reconciled us to Himself by Christ Jesus, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation; to wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto Himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation."

So I want you to pray out loud, "*Dear Lord Jesus, I believe that You are the Son of God, and God raised You from the dead. I ask You Lord Jesus, to forgive all of my sins. Wash them away in Your blood. Thank You Jesus. I receive Your cleansing, Your forgiveness. And now that I have received You Lord Jesus, I have become a Christian. I believe in my heart and I speak with my mouth that Jesus is Lord. Amen.*"

Now God has created you to be a new creation. He has washed away all your bad habits. He has washed away all your sins. He has given you a second chance. He is bringing you into the Kingdom of God, delivering you from the kingdom of darkness into the glorious Light of his Son Jesus. You can walk with Him and talk with Him, knowing that you get to go to heaven because you prayed that prayer. Now you are reconciled to God, that was easy. Now God is going to show you the way to reconcile with your friend or spouse.

If you are alone, separated, or divorced, and want God's help, there is a plan for you to reconcile by applying the principles that you have and to have an opportunity to win them back. So what are you going to do? The first thing you do is to not let this happen in the first place. 1 Cor 7:10-11 says, "And unto the married I command, yet not I, but the Lord, 'Let not the wife depart from her husband. But and if she depart, let her remain unmarried, or be reconciled to her husband; and let not the husband put away his wife.'"

The Bible commanded a wife not to leave her husband. The reality is that some wives leave their husbands for all kinds of reasons. Now if she does leave, let her be unmarried or let her be reconciled. If the husband leaves the wife, the same principle applies.

WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO LET HAPPEN

The question I ask is *what are you going to let happen?* If you are going to stand in agreement for a reconciliation of a divorce or separation, stand in faith with God. Say that you are only going to let that person be reconciled to you and that settles it. There are a lot of people who do not understand the power of the word "**let**". God said, "Let there be light." And there was light. God said, "Let..." and many things happened. So what are you going to let happen? You are only going to let reconciliation happen. That means you are going to cause it and allow it to happen

because of your attitude and behavior changes. You are letting love work in your heart, showing unconditional and sacrificial love, sowing into the other person to reap a harvest. You see you get to do something, the “letting”. So whenever you speak say, “Oh, yes, she only wants to love me and be reconciled.” Because you do not have a hardened heart, you are forgiven.

In 1st Peter Chapter 2 is God’s Manuel on a visitation from God. If I’m going to believe God for reconciliation for my marriage or friendship, then I’m going to need Jesus to show up and talk to my spouse. Do you think that would be the greatest thing in the world? I’m going to use my wife, Miriam as an example, if we had a problem and I needed restoration, and I want Jesus to come and talk to her. The Lord comes to Miriam and says, “Go home.” She is now hearing the voice of the Lord telling her what to do and now she has a decision to make, to do what He says or not. When the Lord speaks and says to her to “Go home”, she will go home. Why? Because the guy is ready. Why is he ready? Because he has been doing what the Word of the Lord says.

HOW YOU GET THE VISITATION

Now here’s *how you get the visitation*. Let’s say you have a restoration problem with a child and a father, mother and daughter, a friendship. It’s the same thing with a boss relationship; you need reconciliation in that. The principle is the same. It doesn’t matter what it is. I want Jesus to show up at your house and talk to you. This is what I have to do in order for Jesus to show up and have a visitation with you.

How many understand, I’m praying I’m expecting Jesus to knock on your door and He will because He is faithful. Here is what you do, Chapter 2 verse 12 of 1st Peter “Having your conversation honest among the Gentiles: that, whereas they speak against you as evildoers, they may by your good works, which they shall behold, glorify God in the day of visitation.” So, my life style has to be without any blemish, including those without the Lord and those who know the Lord. That’s what this verse is saying. So I may work in the state of Oregon where there may be a problem with state and church stuff, I need to work in their presence as respectable.

Since I want Jesus to show up on my visitation for my spouse, then I must live my life respectable in their eyes. Ok, let’s go on. 1pet 2:13 “Submit yourselves to every ordinance of man for the Lord’s sake: whether it be to the king, as supreme;”

All right, the speed limit is 55mph, I want Jesus to show up and talk to you. Then I had better obey the law of the land. When I’m going to cross the street, do I obey the light signal or do I just cross? There’s no car coming, let just go. Submit yourselves to every ordinance of man for the Lord’s sake. I’m doing it for Jesus and Jesus sees me and I want Him to show up and talk to this person. So I’d better do what God says to do. That’s my responsibility for Him to talk to them so they’ll be reconciled to me. Is this beginning to make sense now?

1Pet 2:14 “Or unto governors, as unto them that are sent by him for the punishment of evildoers, and for the praise of them that do well.” So in other words, the policeman is for my benefit. So I had better show respect, honor, and submissiveness to all of God’s people. Because He has put them here for a specific purpose and I want Jesus to show up for a visitation. I need to submit to every ordinance.

1Pet 2:15 “For so is the will of God, that with well doing ye may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men:” I am going to do good in the presence of you, watch me, you may yell and think that he is so “holier than thou”. I do not care what you think; I want a visitation from the Lord. It’s going to happen. And when God knocks on your door, you’ll hear the Lord. Good and loud.

1Pet 2:16 “As free, and not using your liberty for a cloke of maliciousness, but as the servants of God.” I am not doing this for any ill purpose. I’m not doing this because I’m trying to manipulate you. I’m doing it for the purpose of Jesus to show up and have a visitation of the Lord.

1 Pet 2:17 “Honour all men. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the king.” Oh, I’m so glad that you are here! Can you see that I’m honoring with my words and actions? I’m going to love the people that come around me; I’m going to honor them. I’m going to be a very lovable person. Because I want Jesus to show up and have a visitation. I’m going to honor God. I’m going to fear the Lord. I’m going to bless Him, I’m going to give my tithes and offerings. And I’m going to just trust Him in everything because I want Him to show up and have a visitation so I can be reconciled. Can you see what I’m doing? Do you think that God will do this for me? It says, if I do these things, what’s going to happen?

1 Pet 2:18 “Servants, be subject to your masters with all fear; not only to the good and gentle, but also to the froward.” So in my job, my boss is yelling and screaming at me, I just say with all honor, no problem, let me write this down. I just think that this is the greatest place to work for, and I know that you have been whipping on my back and over loading me and giving me everyone else’s job. That’s OK, I’m just going to honor you, because I want God to show up and have a visitation. Aren’t I suppose to do this anyway? Yes. The Lord says he will honor me and I will show up for you.

1 Pet 2:21 “For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:” You mean I have to do this regardless if I want a visitation or not? That’s absolutely correct. So what happens if I blow it? And I just yell, scream, and rail back, “Why are you doing this to me all the time?” You get to start all over, that’s what happens. You just short-circuited two or three weeks or six months. Say I do not want to short circuit anything if I want a visitation from God. So if I want a visitation from God, then I had better do what He tells me to do. I can do it for the Lord’s sake. So who is going to bless me in the long haul? The Lord. God loves me so much. He’ll do it for everybody. Amen. So here is our example: For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps. Now what did Jesus do? Let’s find out.

1 Pet 2:22 “Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth:” Jesus didn’t do anything wrong, he didn’t trick or manipulate anyone. That’s what it’s talking about when it said that there is no guile in his mouth.

1Pet 2:23 “Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously:” Pontius Pilot said, “Who do you think you are, the Son of God? I have the authority to crucify you. I can do whatever I want to you, Jesus. What do you got to say about that? Nothing, he didn’t say a word. When someone comes to you, starts railing on you, and says, “What did you do that to me for? I didn’t do it. He did it!” You can see that you are trying to cover yourself up and are answering back. What did the Lord do? Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again. He kept his mouth shut. Do you want to stay out of an argument? Be quiet. It takes two to argue. When he suffered, he threatened not. Here they are pulling his beard

out of his face. Do you think that hurts? They crowned him with thorns, and what did he say? “Why did you stick me with that? Don’t you know that I could throw you into hell, where you will burn eternally? Did he say that? No, he didn’t say that. He never threatened back. So when things go awry in your life, do not look for retaliation, look for reconciliation. If you are going to reconcile, then you must honor all people. But committed himself to him that judgeth righteously. When Jesus was reviled, he did not revile again. When he suffered he did not threaten back. But he trusted God. He committed himself to God that judgeth righteously. Jesus says, “Ok Father, I commit myself into your hands, you judge this.

I had a similar thing in my life once, I owed a lot of money and this person was trying to bill me for it. So I said ok Holy Spirit, I’m not going to try to come back at this person with threats, reviling, etc. I said, God I just commit it into your hands, you judge righteous. If I owe, I owe. If not get me out. And God got me out. Because I trusted him and I committed myself into his hands. He made the final decision. Isn’t that what I want? A visitation from the Lord. Yes, in Jesus name. So reconciliation is something that can be done because you believe God.

Now lets look at chapter 3 of 1 Peter.

1Pet3:1 “Likewise, ye wives, be in subjection to your own husbands; that, if any obey not the word, they also may without the word be won by the conversation of the wives;” Likewise what? Likewise everything we have just said from 1 Peter 2: verse 11 until the end of the chapter. It is the same thing for each person, male or female. In other words, you wives are to do the same thing the husbands are suppose to do. So if you wives have a husband that is out to lunch and you want a visitation from the Lord to show up to him, do everything we just read from verse 12 on. You husbands that have a wife out to lunch, then do everything from verse 12 on too. Likewise, ye wives, be in subjection to your own husbands. Wives, subject yourself to your own husband, arrange yourself under to your husband. That, if any obey not the word. How many of us know that there are many a men that do not read their Bible. They do not know what is going on about them and do not obey the Word. Arrange yourself under your husband even when they do not obey the Word so, they also may without the word be won by the conversation of the wives. I have to say this, they may be won. It doesn’t say they will be won. You do not have to tell them what to do, you just submit, you just take care because you want a visitation from the Lord. If a husband has a wife out to lunch, you do not have to yell and scream at her, you do not have to say one word, because you are doing everything from verse 12 to here. And the Lord will change them. He knows how to change their heart any way he desires. And you believe God for a visitation, he is not going to see you labor in vain. He’ll help you.

1Pet 3:2 “While they behold your chaste conversation coupled with fear.” This is saying that because you are being so nice and have subjected yourself unto your husband, they will see your respect. So if you have a husband out to lunch and he is not doing the Word of God and you believe God for an outcome and you’re not nagging on him. That they will be won over by your life style because they see how beautiful you are in your life style. They see respect and they will give it to you. And when that happens guess who is talking to them? The Lord, Amen!

1Pet 3:3 “Whose adorning let it not be that outward adorning of plaiting the hair, and of wearing of gold, or of putting on of apparel;” 1Pet 3:4 “But let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, even the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price.” You do not have to go and get yourself all made up all the time. Just be you. If you do not always wear lipstick, that’s fine. It is saying, “Let”. Let it be the hidden man of the heart. It is

talking about the meek and gentle spirit of the person. You just like being around that person. That's the hidden man of the heart. You're fun to be with. People like to be around people who are confident. So be a meek and gentle spirit around the person you are submitting yourself to. So they will be won by your life style to make the change. So when they begin to see the change, they'll like being around you because you changed! Because you are meek and quiet, not harassing or bellowing out bad remarks, just be the neat person because you are following everything that 1 Peter Chapter 2 is telling us to do 11 through the end of the chapter.

Ok, now we are at chapter 3. For after this manner in the old time the Holy women also who trusted in God adorned themselves being in subjection unto their own husband. Even as Sarah obeyed Abraham calling him lord. Who's daughter you are as long as you do well and are not afraid with any amazement. All right so what you are doing you're working for a visitation of God to show up in that life so you can get reconciliation. Likewise you husbands, likewise what? Everything that we said from verses 1- six.

The same goes for the man, shower, shave, put on cologne, look nice, smell nice, talk nice, start having a lifestyle, and respect. Likewise you husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge. If you do not know how to live with your wife and you have arguments go find a book and read it like I'm trying to help you here in reconciliation. Understand that there are differences between women know why they think the way they think, understand why they talk like they talk to get an understanding. Why they are in their feelings instead of in decisions. Understand them, get some knowledge. Live with them because you have learned some knowledge about the opposite sex. Giving honor unto the wife. Honor, bend the knee.

Wow it's Miriam! Praise the Lord! I honor her, respect her. Do you see what I'm saying? As unto the Weaker vessel, weaker not meaning in any dominant wise it's just physical. Honor them. Look I'll be glad to carry in the groceries for you; you went shopping .No problem! I can help you put them away .How many know cans and groceries are heavy. Isn't that showing honor and respect? Aren't you trying to build reconciliation?

Get up and go do something. Show them that you love them. Because you're heirs together of the grace of life, in other words what is good for her is good for me. And if I am going to sow into her so I can reap a harvest of reconciliation, I need to demonstrate my love in action. Because wisdom is proved right by your actions. If you can talk with your heart but you don't have it in there, do something about it, or you're self-deceived.

Finally, be all one of one mind having compassion one of another. Love as brethren, be pitiful, and be courteous. Start having compassion .Wow you worked all day today Miriam I'll bet you're tired, would you like me to fix you something to eat? Of course she would. But how many know that other guys say, "Come on woman! I've been waiting for you here! Now where's dinner?" That's not showing any love or compassion .How are you going to get reconciliation if you act like that. That's not honor. So respect and be courteous. Open the door, be nice. Not rendering evil for evil.

You said that to me so I did that to you .You did that to me so I did that to you, rendering evil for evil isn't going to make reconciliation. Or yelling and screaming or acting out. But contrary wise, blessing, knowing that you are thereunto called that you should inherit a blessing. For he that will love life and see good days let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile. Quit yelling and screaming and trying to trip everybody up. If you want reconciliation then show

God that you love this person with respect and show the person that you love them. Then God will show up and talk to them. That's what we're talking about, visitation from God .Let him eschew evil and do good, let him seek peace, for the eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and His ears are open unto their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against the evil.

So what we're looking for is God to show up and bless your partner, bless your friend, bless your relationship. Get God to work it out. Now, once you get your reconciliation started, you start to do some things and your partner starts to respond, and now you're building a bridge and the bridge is completed. And now you're communicating, things are coming along it's getting a little better and better.

Now, let's take Miriam my wife, and I've got 10 things here, you got to start making confessions every day about your successful reconciliation. Now, let's say that we got reconciled and everything is kind of cool yet there are some rough waters. And now we're back to talking and communicating God has showed up, I did some changes and she did some changes, now we got the whole thing smoothed out, let's keep it that way.

SPEAKING THE PROMISES OF GOD

So if I pray to God now he's going to cover us .So if I start *speaking the promises of God*, declaring what God's Word says about our marriage, what do you think is going to happen? Especially if I did this in her hearing or if she did this for me. Can you see that this works? Listens to this I have ten things here. (*Insert your name in place of my name, for your marriage.*)

1. Confession, I put my name and I put her name in it. **Robert and Miriam's marriage is fulfilled with honor.** What a confession, it's fulfilled with honor. Likewise you husbands dwell with them according to knowledge giving honor unto the wife as unto the weaker vessel, being heirs together of the grace of life that your prayers be not hindered 1 Peter 3:7. So if I don't want my prayers hindered I'd better honor my wife. So I'm declaring that our marriage is fulfilled with honor.

2. **Robert and Miriam's marriage is fulfilled with sexual union.** Hebrews 13:4 says, marriage is honorable in all and the bad is undefiled. In other words if your going to have a marriage you'd better have fulfillment in sexual union .So if you declare the promises of God, He's going to honor His word. And He's going to keep each partners eyes on each other and not someone else. Because a lot of people have a problem with reconciliation, because one partner found someone else, but God's word will bring them back .We went through 1st Peter 2 and 3.

3. **Robert and Miriam's marriage is fulfilled in relationship.** The word fulfilled means completed. Ephesians 4:32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ sake hath forgiven you. Ephesians 5:25 Husbands love your wives even as Christ also loved the Church and gave Himself for it .Can you see a fulfilled relationship in that?

4. **Robert and Miriam's marriage is fulfilled in accomplishments together.** Ephesians 5:31 For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother and shall be joined unto his wife and they to shall be one flesh. Philippians 2:13 says, For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of His good pleasure. God is working in both of you to do His good will and pleasure, in fulfillment in

accomplishments together .Can you see declaring the promises of God and your walking in faith, these things are going to happen.

5. **Robert and Miriam's marriage is fulfilled with finances.** Psalm 35:27 Let them shout for joy and be glad that favor my righteous cause, yeah let them say continually that the Lord be magnified which has pleasure in the prosperity of His servant.

6. **Robert and Miriam's marriage is fulfilled in health.** 3 John 1:2 Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health even as thy soul prosper.

7. **Robert and Miriam's marriage is fulfilled in communication.** Ephesians 4:29 Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying that it may minister grace unto the hearers. Can you see God sending forth words and fulfilling your communication? I would never say anything bad, would you? But people do it and it's a break down of communication, which leads into separation, then they have to go through this restoration of reconciliation. But if you say our marriage is fulfilled in communication, then it is.

8. **Robert and Miriam's marriage is fulfilled with love.** 1 John 4:16 And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us, God is love, and he that dwelleth in love, dwelleth in God, and God in him .So it's fulfilled with love, and love covers a multitude of sins. Amen?

9. **Robert and Miriam's marriage always hear the voice of the Lord.** John10:4 And when he putteth forth his own cheap he goeth before them and the sheep follow him for they know his voice and a stranger will they not follow but will flee from him for they know not the voice of strangers. So if they're going to walk in love and walk together they both have got to hear the voice of the Lord. And that's going to keep their communication open and keep them reconciled.

10. **Robert and Miriam's marriage cannot be broken.** Matthew 19:6 What therefore God hath joined together let not man put asunder. Can you see that if you begin to declare the promises of God and you let the Holy Spirit work in you, what do you think is going to keep it staying together because you both walk together hand in hand with the Lord, and God is for you so God is going to keep you reconciled. Can you see the word of the Lord working?

Let's pray. Father we praise you and thank you right now, in the name of Jesus, about faith filled confession everyday will keep us successful in reconciliation. Lord we thank you for the word that's gone forth and we thank you for those who prayed the prayer of salvation and given a commitment to the Lord. We bless you now Lord and we thank you that every person reading this book and every person in this room has come to a knowledge and truth of the Lord that he is for us in reconciliation. Lord, we thank you that when we put our faith in you we have the opportunity that you would hear us and reconcile us in Jesus name. We bless you and thank you for the word that goes forth that it will not return to us void, that we shall accomplish that which we said, in Jesus name, we walk by faith and not by sight, and we thank you Lord and we bless you. Amen.
